Youth Eligibility:

Potentially eligible Out-of-School Youth will be aged 18-24, eligible to work in the US, not attending school, and meet at least <u>one</u> of the following criteria: *Must be screened for eligibility before enrolling in school

- School Drop Out
- Has not attended school in the most recent calendar quarter
- Has received HS Diploma, is low income, and is either: basic skills deficient or English is not primary language of household
- Justice involved
- In foster care, or after age 16 has left foster care
- Homeless

- Low Income and one of the following:
- --parent or guardian that is currently or previously incarcerated for felony conviction
- --parent or guardian with no HS diploma or GED
- --attends or has attended a chronically under performing school
- Pregnant or Parenting
- 18-24 with poor or no work history

Notes:

- Gain career skills needed for in-demand occupations
- Receive financial assistance for tuition and cost of books
- Additional supportive services available
- Eligibilty criteria varies
- Limited funding available







For individuals aged 18 or older, and interested in Adult Services, bring the following for verification of income:

- At least 2 pay stubs from the previous 6 months
- Verification of receiving one of the following: SNAP, TANF, HUD, SSI, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservation (FDPIR) now or in the last 6 months
- Homeless- a letter from a shelter or individuals providing residency

Dislocated Worker Eligibility: *Must be screened for eligibility before enrolling in school

For individuals that have been terminated, laid off, or have lost self-employment income, bring the following verification:

- Notice of layoff or termination, or;
- Verification of receiving unemployment, TAA certification or WARN notice, or;

• Bankruptcy documentation, Business license, and Most recent tax return.

AND

• Current unemployment insurance documentation

*Additional criteria applies, contact a staff member for more information.

For individuals that have become Displaced Homemakers (individuals who have been providing unpaid services in the home) bring the following verification:

- Divorce papers, Court documentation, Notice of layoff, or Death records
- AND (one of the following)
- Current unemployment insurance documentation
- Pay stubs
- Public assistant records

For individuals who have been relocated or are experiencing change due to spouse's military connection bring the following verification:

• Military change orders

AND (one of the following)

- Marriage certificate
- Military independent ID
- Verification of military spouse status
- AND (one of the following)
- Current unemployment insurance documentation
- Pay stubs
- Public assistant records
